Old EHS Committee Format

- Meetings were held in a conference room environment
- **Set members**, 1 member from each department
- Each crew met monthly for 1 hour
- Committee members would **discuss** any safety issues or concerns
- Committee members would have light refreshments provided
- Minutes were not recorded, and goals were not communicated to sites

COMMITMENT

- Committee members were not able to make changes in their work areas
- Communication to the site was not happening
- Engagement for committee was low
- Committee created work with no safety driven solutions
- No committee involvement and support from the site leadership team





WHAT DID WE DO ABOUT IT?

Shelby EHS Committee Vision:

Empowering paper manufacturing and converting safety though proactive collaboration, education and innovation. The Shelby EHS Committee is dedicated to fostering a culture of awareness, prevention, and continuous improvement to ensure the well-being of all employees, the protection of the environment, and the sustainability of our operations.

Current EHS Committee Structure

- Committee meeting time is dedicated to floor activities, training and safety focused conversations
- EHS Team actively encouraging all employees to participate on EHS Committee
- Committee meets monthly and schedule is **set** for the full calendar year. Every crew has an opportunity to participate
- Members perform safety related tasks they identified in their work areas
- Lunch and learn session with **participation** from EHS and Leadership Team
- Minutes for the committee are recorded and shared with sites and Leadership Team

1. 8:00 AM - 8:30 AM: Wellness Seminar

- · Certified Early Intervention Specialist leads the wellness seminar.
- · Employees participate in the seminar focusing on the month's wellness topic.

2. 8:30 AM - 12:00 PM: Safety Tasks

- Employees sign up for safety tasks to complete with a partner or in small groups.
- · Assigned safety tasks may include:
 - · Equipment inspections
 - · Safety audits
 - · Hazard identification walkthroughs
 - · Emergency response drills
- · Committee members oversee and assist with safety tasks as needed.

3. 12:00 PM - 1:00 PM: Lunch and Feedback

- · Lunch provided for all attendees.
- · Mill leadership invited to join for lunch.
- · Informal discussion and feedback session:
 - Mill leadership obtains feedback or thoughts from committee members regarding safety initiatives and workplace concerns.
 - Opportunity for open dialogue and collaboration.

4. 1:00 PM - 2:00 PM: Safety Initiative Discussion


- · Committee reconvenes to discuss a safety initiative:
 - · Safety spotlight on a specific safety topic or best practice.
 - · Workshop on a relevant safety issue or training session.
- Committee members share insights, experiences, and ideas related to the safety initiative.
- · Action items and next steps for implementing the safety initiative are then identified.

Note: The agenda allows for a balanced mix of wellness, hands-on safety tasks, networking opportunities with mill leadership, and focused discussions on safety initiatives, ensuring productive use of the 6-hour meeting duration.
